a Sgt E-5. His clean date is November 17, 1994 and has been in service at various levels with NA since January 1995. Today, he is president of the Northern California Region Service Organization Board of Directors, a volunteer

position. He has two adult sons, and has completed 24 marathons in the US, Canada, and Australia as

well as winning bronze medals in the Steeple Chase at two Masters World Games and placed in the top 10 in three other events.

At 8:00 PM tonight, we will have a presentation called *Everything You Wanted to Know About NA, But Were Afraid to Ask!* All the

basic info about NA will be presented, included how we developed, how the 12 steps work, what we do at meetings, why we are entirely self-supporting, and why helping other addicts is such a very critical part of each member's recovery process, as well as who is a Sponsor and who is a Sponcee.

MEDICAL CARE is available from the time you arrive. We will provide TB testing upon your arrival. Other infectious disease screening will be available. Check with your Tent Leader and the daily schedules for updates.

No ins and outs. We can not keep track of people if they leave and come back in again. If you want to leave, you may do so at any time. If you leave, you can not come back in during the remainder of the event. If you leave early you may not take supplies/ shoes/clothing given to you during the event. Otherwise, people would just show up for the goodies and then leave.

What is a Stand Down

Stand Downs were named in Vietnam for the relatively safe times when combat troops could get a shave, shower, clean clothing and other comforts. The term was used again twelve years ago to describe a way to help displaced vets by the Vietnam + of San Diego. Since that time, there have been hundreds of Stand Downs held throughout the country. This is the third EBSD. *What is LZ Burbine?*

The East Bay Stand Down is named after Len Burbine, who was one of our original organizers. Len passed away before the Stand Down came to be so, as was the tradition in Vietnam to name a helicopter landing zone (LZ) after one of our fallen comrades, we have named the East Bay Stand Down after USMC Sergeant Major

Who is doing all this?

(Retired) Leonard Burbine.

Our main sponsors are The Vietnam Veterans of Diablo Valley, the Concord Vet Center, the La-

dies Auxiliary of the Antioch VFW Post 6435, The Danville-Sycamore Valley Rotary, SBC Pac Bell, United Airlines, the United Way of the Bay Area, Eli Lilly & Co., the California Department of Veterans Affairs, The United States Army 63d RSC and many more. We

have over 800 volun¬teers from around the bay area signed up to help.

Why are we doing this?

Because stand downs have proven to work to help break the cycle of homelessness. Because you, the participants, earned extra help by virtue of your service to our country. Because you have proven you can complete a tough assignment in your past, we know you can do it again. This is a hand up, not a handout.

LEGAL HELP

We will have the Superior Courts from Alameda, San Francisco, Contra Costa, Solano, Santa Clara and San Joaquin Counties will be convening here on Saturday, August 12. If you have misdemeanor violations which have or have not gone to warrant you may have the judge decide on them here. Alternatives to sentencing are available while you are at this event. You will be given "sign offs" for every meet¬ing or service you attend. When you go to court here, those sign offs will be taken into consideration in your sentances.

There will be no arrests at Stand Down

In order to receive a hearing on your pending misdemeanors or to find out if you have any, you must register with the legal folks no later than 12 noon on Friday, August 11. There will be other legal help for you through attorneys in the legal tents. This help will be for issues like child support, tax problems, bankruptcy, or other common problems.

Basic Camp rules and information: LZ Burbine is a safe place for you and for the people working here. The rules ap-

for you and for the people working here. The rules apply to both participants and volunteers/staff. We will treat everyone with respect and concern. We require all participants to attend meetings/

services while they are here. These meetings and services will be available all the time. You must attend at least two meetings daily at 10 a.m. and at 2 p.m. All participants must attend meet¬ings unless they are participants in court or at another appointment. This is in hopes that participants will get more out of the event than just food, clothing, shoes and a couple of movies.
